PROGRAM GUIDANCE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE COMMISSIONER EMERGENCY SERVICE TRAINING CENTER CAPITAL GRANT PROGRAM The 2024 GRANT APPLICATION PERIOD is APRIL 1, 2024 through MAY 15, 2024

The Office of the State Fire Commissioner (OSFC), pursuant to Act 104 of 2022 and 35 Pa. C.S. § 7385.2, manages the Emergency Service Training Center Capital Grant Program (Program).

Section 1. Source of Funding.

The Program is funded through money transferred under 3 Pa. C.S. § 1113(a)(5).

Section 2. Eligible Recipients.

Eligible recipients of Program funds include emergency services training centers, community colleges, county-owned facilities, municipal or fire department-owned facilities or nonprofit countywide associations. A privately owned facility shall not be eligible for Program funds.

Section 3. Definitions.

A countywide association will be recognized by the Commissioner when it is a chartered or incorporated entity where training is available to all firefighters and other emergency responders within the county where it is established.

A facility for the purposes of this section shall be a building, group of buildings, or property consisting of more than one multi-function training structures, such as classrooms, training towers/burn buildings, and other fixed props.

Section 4. Eligible Projects.

Act 104 requires Program funds to be used for the following:

- 1. Establish or modernize facilities that house firefighting equipment, ambulances, or rescue vehicles.
- 2. Acquire or renovate existing structures to house firefighting equipment, ambulances, or rescue vehicles or for the construction or modernization of facilities.
- 3. Repair or purchase firefighting, ambulance, or rescue equipment as necessary to provide proper and adequate training.

When determining whether a project in a Program grant application conforms with the requirements of Act 104, OSFC will consider whether the project funds will be used to further one of the three purposes listed above, with the understanding that facilities are

frequently used for multiple purposes. Applications seeking funds for multi-purpose facilities will not be automatically disqualified.

Section 5. Restrictions.

Capital grants administered under this section may not be used for:

- 1. Operating expenses.
- 2. Refinancing of renovated structures.
- 3. Refinancing the construction or modernization of facilities.
- 4. Apparatus equipment, communication equipment or accessory equipment.
- 5. Reduction of debt or other obligations issued prior to the effective date of Act 104 (November 3, 2022).

Section 6. Applications.

Program grant applications shall be open to organizations for forty-five (45) days each year. OSFC will process the applications and select the applications to be awarded within forty-five (45) days of the closing of the application period.

Applications shall be made in a web-based portal that is available free of charge to interested applicants.

Section 7. Amounts and criteria.

Capital grant amounts shall be distributed in an amount between \$25,000 to \$100,000. OSFC shall publish the range of grant award amounts annually.

Each Program grant application must include a project narrative and project budget. An Application Review Committee, consisting of OSFC grants staff along with two (2) members of the State Fire Advisory Board, will review the Program grant applications and recommend approval or denial to the Commissioner. The Application Review Committee will score the applications against the scoring rubric, attached as Exhibit A.

Section 8. Use.

Capital grants may be used in combination with Fire Company and Emergency Medical Services Grant funding to complete projects if approved by the Commissioner.
